

PAEDIATRIC FIRST AID



Qualification Overview

The level 3 Award in Paediatric First Aid has been developed mainly for those who work with, and have the responsibility for the welfare of children and babies. It is intended for learners already working or preparing to work in industry.

Its topics are regarded by Early Years Foundation Stage as being important to maintaining good practice by providing safe, prompt and effective treatment of injuries and ill health of infants and children who are under the care of a trained professional.

Guided Learning Hours

The number of tutor-led contact hours required to support learner achievement of this qualification is 20 hours. Only 12 hours are class contact, there is time for reflection and personal research.

Learner Entry Requirements

None are required to access this qualification

Learner ID Requirements

Learners must bring identification and this must be validated by the trainer and recorded on the learner registration form. Also learners should bring their Unique Learner Number to the course if they have one.

Assessment

Multiple choice questions and task controlled assessment via a learner assessment logbook.

Learners will be made aware from the start of the course that there is on-going assessment.

To achieve this qualification, all assessment criteria as detailed opposite must be achieved. Trainers will assess learners throughout the course. Learners will pass or fail the course

Successful learners will receive a National Qualification Certificate. This qualification is valid for 3 years. In order to re-qualify after 3 years learners must be assessed against all the learning outcomes and assessment criteria.

COURSE SUMMARY:

This qualification is made up of two units and summarised below:

1. Understand the role and responsibilities of a Paediatric first aider.
2. Be able to assess an emergency situation and act safely and effectively.
3. Be able to manage an unresponsive casualty who is breathing normally and not breathing normally.
4. Be able to provide first aid for an infant and a child who has a foreign body airway obstruction
5. Be able to provide first aid to an infant and a child who is wounded and bleeding
6. Know how to provide first aid to an infant and a child who is suffering from shock
